

VOLUNTEER COUNSELORS NEEDED!!!!!

Ask anyone who has ever been a camper at Covenant Cedars Bible Camp and see what they remember. Typically you will find that they easily remember who their counselors were for the week no matter how long ago it was. God uses the counselors for Summer Youth Camps in very special ways to build relationships and preach the gospel through love.

Either you or someone you know would make a GREAT Summer Youth Camp Counselor. Don't wait, get involved, and see what God will do!

Anyone who wants to be a Volunteer Counselor at CCBC needs to go through the process that follows.



STEP ONE: Prayer

Start the application process by praying for what God has for you this summer. Please involve your parents in this process. Pray for God's will for Covenant Cedars and for the volunteer team that will be assembled for the summer.

STEP TWO: Complete and Return Application

Fill out the application online at www.cedars.org under the Get Involved tab. Your application must be received by Cedars no later than February 1st, 2015. Please fill out the application completely and thoroughly. You must at this time provide information for your references.

STEP THREE: Interview

A member of the Covenant Cedars staff will be emailing you to set up an interview. These interviews will be done a series of questions by email. It is very important that you put your email address and phone number on your application.

STEP FOUR: Selecting

Covenant Cedars will be in contact with you to: extend an offer for you to be a volunteer, or to decline your application. This will be done by email. It is our hope to have all of our volunteer staff selected by March 1st, 2015.

STEP FIVE: Training

You will be required to attend the counselor training retreat at Covenant Cedars Bible Camp on March 20-21, 2015.
